

SCHOOL LANE QUESTIONNAIRE EXTENSION OF DOUBLE YELLOW LINES

As a large number of residents have raised concerns over the danger of cars parking so close to a blind junction at the top of School Lane (at the junction with the A272) and feel that it creates an unacceptable level of danger at the junction which could lead to a serious road traffic accident (there have already been a large number of minor collisions reported). The Parish Council have held numerous discussions with East Sussex County Council (ESCC) about extending the double yellow lines and this has now been on their waiting list for more than 5 years and we wish to apply pressure to get this work done as soon as possible.

ESCC have indicated that one of the items that will delay the extension of the double yellow lines is that we need to get feedback from the village and therefore we have decided to do this in advance. Please can you reply to the following questions and give your name and address details. Your personal information will only be used to ensure there is no double-counting and will not be passed onto anyone else or published. Surveys with no name and address will not be counted.

The current plan is to extend the current double yellow lines on both sides of School Lane and take the lines as far as the entrances of the first drive ways on both sides (e.g. entrance to Marlowe House, Fantails). We will try to take account of all comments made and we plan to use the information from this survey to put pressure on ESCC to bring forward changes.
