## **Hadlow Down Community Centre (HDCC)**

<u>Highways:</u> Numerous referrals have been made to East Sussex Highways. As a result some remedial works have been carried out (e.g. patching of the layby by Tinkers Park and straightening of the 50 mph roundel at the top of Tinkers Lane), in other cases potholes have been ringed with white marking, and some cases have not met East Sussex Highways criteria (e.g. the surface degradation around four small manholes on the A272 at the top of Wheelers Lane).

<u>Footpaths:</u> A number of concerns have been lodged with East Sussex CC and will be discussed at the forthcoming SLR meeting.

<u>Quarterly Risk Assessment</u> has been carried out and report submitted for consideration at the August meeting.

<u>SID:</u> Work has continued to try to progress installation of a speed indicator display sign. The site licenses have recently been agreed by ESCC and hopefully erection of the poles will take place shortly.

- 1. The risk assessment for the burial ground has been completed.
- 2. The overgrown verge alongside the pavement on the A272 to Waste Wood has been cut back.
- 3. Vegetation around the burial ground kissing gate has been cleared to provide greater visibility for pedestrians crossing the A272.
- 4. An audit of the roads to the west and north of Hadlow down has been completed and more than 40 faults logged with ESCC Highways.
