Draft Local Plan Regulation 18

The Draft Local Plan Regulation 18 Documents for consideration at the Local Plan Sub-Committee which was held on 29 January are now available on the council's website: Wealden Draft Local Plan Regulation 18 Document - Wealden District Council - Wealden District Council This is a significant series of documents which covers over 6000 pages.

These will be put to the Full Council on the 8th February 2024. If passed a public consultation will be held for 8 weeks from the beginning of March.

The draft plan does not have specific chapters on Hadlow Down as the village is not classed as a sustainable place for development but the draft plan does cover a number of new progressive policies which will impact on developments. Hadlow Down is still expected to gain from windfall developments.

Residents are encouraged to withhold any comments until the official consultation starts. Any comments prior to the official consultation will be ignored.

Environmental Health (Licensing) - Environmental Framework
